This measure would provide up to 28 million dollars to fund a <u>new</u>, indoor warm-water pool that would be available to the community throughout the year including features that improve accessibility for seniors and people with disabilities; as well as a <u>new</u> competition pool that provides space for swim lessons and training; and a new outdoor pool with a slide.
